## Re: Ford Chapman Gulf Federal No. 1 LC-061581

Gentlemen:

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Reference is made to the recent completion of the subject well with a potential test run 5/7/80 for 84 barrels oil, 12 barrels water and 42 MCF gas per day.

The nearest gas sales line is four miles distant, located in the  $St_{th}$ te of Texas, and operated Conoco, Inc. On a gas volume test run 6/30/80 by Conoco, the well produced 36 MCF per day, with cost of connection estimated to be between \$25,000 and \$30,000.

Conoco, Inc. ad ised that the volume of gas available from the Gulf Federal No. 1 is not sufficient to justify the cost of connection. However, if the second well should result in production with a gas volume equal to or greater than the number one well then a connection can be justified.

Conoco also advised that due to the number of governmental agencies involved and their usual entanglement of red tape, clearance for a right-of-way across the State line may take from six to twelve months. They will proceed with the filings on the assumption that the number two well will be productive.

Therefore it is respectfully requested that permission be granted to vent gas from the Gulf Federal No. 1 until the number two well shall be completed and the subsequent clearance to Conoco to construct a gathering line.
