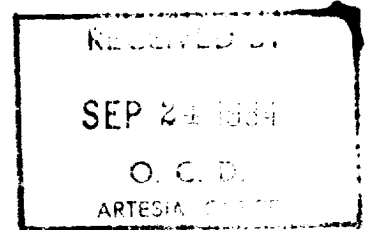

Dear Mr. Gilliam:

Mobil Producing TX. & N.M. Inc (MPTM) respectfully requests permission to flare small volumes of casinghead gas associated with the oil production from the recently recompleated well in the Cherry Canyon zone. The well potentialed June 13, 1984 for 28 barrels of oil, 341 barrels of water and 4 MCF of gas per day. Current production is 8 barrels of oil, 25 barrels water and gas is too small to measure. MPTM is using a portion of the casinghead gas for fuel for the gas engine for the pumping unit and plans to install a heater treater to treat the oil.

MPTM anticipates the casinghead gas will further decline until there will be an insufficient amount available for lease use. Infact, provisions have been made to use propane gas to supplement the available casinghead gas as it declines.

The New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission has advised that we must receive your approval to flare the casinghead gas or shut the well in. Your approval is, therefore, requested to flare the gas. If you approve, please sign this letter in the space provided and send a copy of the approval to the NMOCD in the envelope provided and return a copy to MPTM.
