

6. Construction Materials:
  - A. Surfacing materials will be caliche and will be purchased from a Federal pit located in the SW/4, Sec. 7, T24S, R32E. Pit has a current archeological clearance, survey conducted by Archaeological Survey Consultants, 11/08/86, report #ASC 86-71.
7. Methods for Handling Waste Disposal:
  - A. Drill cuttings will be disposed in the reserve pits.
  - B. Drilling fluids will evaporate in reserve pits until dry.
  - C. Water produced during tests will be disposed in reserve pits.
  - D. All trash will be buried in a separate pit and covered with a minimum of 36" of dirt.
  - E. The location will be cleaned of all debris as soon as drilling operations are completed.
8. Ancillary Facilities:
  - A. None anticipated.
9. Well Site Layout:
  - A. Exhibit 'D' displays the well site and rig layout.
10. Plans for Restoration of the Surface:
  - A. After completion of operations, all materials not needed for producing the well will be removed. Pits will be filled and the location cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the well site in good condition.
  - B. Any unguarded pits containing fluids will be fenced until dry.
  - C. If the test well results in a non-commercial test, the well pad and new access road will be rehabilitated to BLM requirements.
11. Surface Ownership:
  - A. The surface is Federal. Grazing allottee is listed on Pertinent Lease Data sheet.
