- 6) Circulate hole to remove any oil or gas.
- 7) Sting into retainer, sqz. with 5.6 sxs. Cls "B" (1.2 bbls), cap retainer with 14.4 sxs Cls "B" (3 bbls). Plug #1 897' - 639
- 8) Perforate 4 1/2" casing @ 600 ft.
- 9) Break Circulation down 4 1/2" casing and up 7" x 4 1/2" annulus.
- 10 Pump 110 sxs. Cls "B" to fill casing and 7" x 4 1/2" annulus Cmt. Plug No. 2 - 600' to surface.
- 11 Cut casing of 3 ft. below grd. Level. Dry hole marker will be installed when all wells plugged.
- 12 No surface reclimation will be conducted as per surface agreement with Navajo Nation. (see attached)

RE: Monument Valley Acreage Substitution

Dear Mr. Watson:

I am writing to confirm the understanding of the parties at our meeting of October 17, 1988 held at the Minerals Department Conference Room in Window Rock.

At our meeting, Akhtar Zaman, Director of the Minerals Department, was presented a draft letter with exhibits attached. Exhibit "A" describes 3,645 acres located near Monument Valley that were previously selected in Exhibit "A" of the 1987 Operating Agreement. Exhibit "B" identifies 3,640 acres which Chuska proposes to substitute for the Exhibit "A" acreage. Chuska has requested this substitution because any proposed mineral development in the Monument Valley area will be subject to extensive environmental review.

As I stated at the meeting, in my opinion there is no reason to conclude that mineral development near Monument Valley will be absolutely prohibited. Therefore, a "prior condition" does not exist with respect to this acreage.

This acreage is identical to the lands described in Exhibit "A" of Chuska's May 26 and July 21, 1988 acreage reallocation requests.

We were unaware at our meeting that this Exhibit "B" was not identical to either Exhibit "B" previously submitted on May 26 or July 21, 1988.

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However, the Navajo Nation is anxious to see some development result from the operating agreement and to work cooperatively with the operator for the mutual benefit of the parties. In this spirit, we are willing to accept the acreage reallocation subject to the following understanding:

1. Chuska will immediately designate, pursuant to Section 5 of the Operating Agreement, the lands located at T.29N, R.19W (Rattlesnake, New Mexico) and T.40N, R.29E (Black Rock, Arizona) 670 and 40 acres, respectively. Chuska will assume responsibility for plugging the existing abandoned wells at Rattlesnake which are located on Chuska's designated acreage. Chuska's responsibility in this instance shall be solely to plug said wells and shall not include any associated rehabilitation, including land or otherwise, unless Chuska selects such lands for their operations. If such operations occur at any abandoned site, Chuska will be responsible for all rehabilitation as required in the operating agreement.

2. Within six months, Chuska will designate or relinquish the following lands:

T.25N, R.19W	(Beautiful Mountain, 320 acres)
T.26N, R.19W	(Beautiful Mountain, 240 acres)
T.27N, R.17W	(Table Mesa, 450 acres)
T.32N, R.19W	(Canal Creek, 80 acres)

3. The remainder of the acreage will be designated or relinquished on or before the date the final designation is

¹ These lands are located south of the meander of the San Juan River. Chuska's description identifies 240 acres in section 33 and 40 acres in section 34. Our information shows 65 acres in section 33 and 238 acres in section 34. This acreage needs to be verified.

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
required pursuant to the Operating Agreement. These remaining lands in Utah lie in T.40S, R.21E (480 acres) and T.41S, R.25E (160 acres).


