Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* **On the morning of 1-24-08, a frac consultant discovered a 2% KCl water spill of approximately 135 BBL at the Culpepper Martin #100S, due to a leak out of two bullet holes in a frac tank due to vandalism. Upon discovery, the supervisor dispatched a water truck to pull the remaining fluid from the 400 BBL frac tank with the two bullet holes, from which 265 BBL was pulled, resulting in 135 BBL of 2% KCl water released. The ground was covered with snow and visible extension of the spill remained within 40' of the tanks, with all spilled fluids remaining on location.**

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* **All spilled fluids remained on location, with none recoverable. After the ground has dried, sampling will take place to determine the extent of soil penetration. The location will then be evaluated for any further remediation, if indicated from sampling.**
