

Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* At approximately 9:50 am on February 19, 2008, the Kelly GC A7 below grade tank ignited and burned for approximately 45 minutes. An internal investigation revealed that the ignition plug, that covers a separators ignition port, was inadvertently left off after the Operations Technician had blown down the scrubber while preparing to start the compressor. The blowing down of the separator introduced combustible gases to the below grade tank which had snow cover. It is suspected that the wind blew stray gases toward the open ignition port, ignited and flashed back towards the below grade tank. A small amount of condensate and lube oil mix caught fire resulting in the 45 minute blaze. The Operations Technician immediately contacted supervisors, shut-in the well, and controlled access to the location from a safe distance. BP notified the NMOCD within 10 minutes of the reported fire. Due to extremely muddy road conditions, the NMOCD allowed BP to monitor the burn from a safe distance rather than attempt to extinguish. Findings from the investigation have been shared with all employees in the Farmington OC.											
Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* Fire damage to a 95 barrel below grade tank, separator, and some miscellaneous piping.
