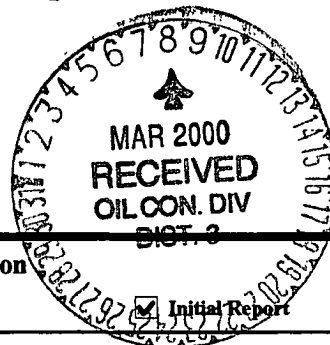

Released condensate was removed immediately after discovery. Soils were removed within 12 hours of discovery. Tank and pit tank moved and an estimated 10 cu. yds. of material was excavated from within the bermed area and landfarmed on site.		
Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken. (Attach Additional Sheets If Necessary) All condensate contained within tank secondary containment. Contaminated soil excavated vertically and horizontally to the extent of no visible contamination.
