Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.*
A 1-inch blow down valve on the compressor dump line header was accidentally left open. On May 29, 2016, a spec truck recovered 4 bbls of freestanding fluids and a construction crew removed a portion of the impacted gravel and soil.

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.*
Spilled fluids were contained on the location.

- Spec truck recovered 4 bbls of freestanding fluid on May 29, 2016.
- On May 29, 2016, a portion of the impacted soil and gravel was removed and transported to the landfarm for disposal.
- Remaining impacted soil and gravel will be excavated and transported to the landfarm for disposal.
- A confirmation sample will be collected and analyzed for BTEX, TPH (GRO/DRO), and chlorides.
- Additional cleanup actions will be taken if analytical laboratory results exceed NMOCD action levels based on site ranking.
- Results will be included in the Final C-141 report.
