Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* **A ConocoPhillips Company employee discovered a produced water and condensate spill at the San Juan 28-5 #79 on the afternoon of 1/25/08. At the time, the volume of the spill was believed to be less than 5 BBL. The spill was due to a leaking fiberglass pit. Upon discovery, the pit was emptied, and the well was shut in. Due to road conditions, no immediate clean up was possible.**

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* **A clean up crew excavated the impacted soil, which totaled approximately 40 cubic yards, from inside the berm and transported the affected soils to Envirotech's landfarm on 4/25/08. Based on the volume of soil and the analysis of soil samples, the spill amount was determined to be 1.5 BBL of condensate and 4.5 BBL of produced water.**
