All spilled fluids remained in the berm. None of the fluids were recovered.										
Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* All of the spilled fluids remained on location in the berm. The spill impacted soil on the ground surface around the tank. The affected soils will be assessed for environmental impact. To prevent reoccurrence, COPC will continue to monitor tank levels.
