Dear Sir:

On February 21, 1956 we wrote you regarding our requirements concerning the transfer of the oil properties of A.P. Buzard, G.L. Gibbons and Elmer L. White in McKinley County to the Walker Dome Oil Company. Since that time we have received forms filed on the #3 Santa Fe well indicating ownership transfer on this well, which I believe is the only producing well involved at the present time. However in our previous letter we stated that it would be necessary that Walker Dome Oil Company post either individual \$5000 one-well bonds or a \$10,000 blanket bond with the Oil Conservation Commission before the ownership transfer could be approved. We also notified you on February 21 that we could not approve a Notice of Intention to Drill on the Walker Dome Oil Company #6 Santa Fe in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11-15N-10W until this well had been properly bonded or covered by a blanket bond. We are therefore holding all forms that you have filed on the #3 Santa Fe showing transfer of ownership and also all forms you have filed on the #6 Santa Fe.

I would like to point out that you have drilled the #6 well without proper authority and in violation of Rule 101 of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission. This rule is found on page 10 of the Revised Rules and Regulations, a copy of which we are enclosing herewith. In view of the above facts you are hereby notified that all operations on your McKinley County leases should immediately cease until further notification from this office. I would also like to remind you that Form C-110, Authorization to Transport, has not been approved on the #3 Santa Fe well and therefore no oil can be legally sold from this well until such time as Form C-110 has been approved.

However in our previous letter we stated that it would be necessary that Walker Home Oil Company post either individual \$2000 one-well bonds or a \$10,000 blanket bond with the Oil Conservation Commission before the ownership transfer could be approved. We also notified you on February 15 that we could not approve a Notice of Intention to Drill on the Walker Home Oil Company #6 Santa Fe in the NE 1/4 Section 11-12N-10W until this well had been properly bonded or covered by a blanket bond. We are therefore holding all forms that you have filed on the #3 Santa Fe showing transfer of ownership and also all forms you have filed on the #6 Santa Fe.

I would like to point out that you have drilled the #6 well without proper authority and in violation of Rule 101 of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission. This rule is found on page 10 of the Revised Rules and Regulations, a copy of which we are enclosing herewith. In view of the above facts you are hereby notified that all operations of your McKinley County lease should immediately cease until further notification from this office. I would also like to remind you that Form C-110, Authorization to Transport, has not been approved on the #3 Santa Fe well and therefore no oil can be legally sold from this well until such time as Form C-110 has been approved.
