Gentlemen:

We are in receipt of your inquiry concerning the above referenced matter.

We have reviewed our well files of the subject well and have ascertained that we were in error in reporting a hole in the casing on our monthly Report of Operations (Form 3160-6). Our records show a hole in the tubing, not the casing.

This well was a marginal producer of oil when the hole in the tubing developed, having made only 21 barrels during the last month that it was on production. However, the well consistantly made in excess of One Hundred Thousand cubic feet of gas per day (100 MCFPD) while it was in production, which gas was used to operate pumping equipment and seperators on the lease.

The nearest market for the gas is Gas Co. of New Mexico's main line to Albuqueruqe, approximately four and one-half miles distant. At current gas prices it is not economical to construct the necessary pipeline to market the gas.

We hereby request that this well be placed in inactive status until such time as oil and gas prices increase to the point where it is once again economical to produce the same.
