

**THE APPLICATION OF CONTINENTAL  
OIL COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.**

**ORDER NO. MC-1321-A**

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on September 20, 1965, for permission to dually complete its Northeast Haynes Apache Well No. 5 located in Unit E of Section 22, Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Ballard Pictured Cliffs Pool and oil from the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool.

Now, on this 10th day of October, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Northeast Haynes Apache Well No. 5 located in Unit E of Section 22, Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico in such a manner as to produce gas from the Ballard-Pictured Cliffs Pool and oil from the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

**PROVIDED HOWEVER,** That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

**PROVIDED FURTHER,** That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual GOR Test Period for the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:** That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders of the Commission may deem necessary.

- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor invade correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, and the same is hereby authorized to dual complete its Northeast Payne Apache Well No. 2 located in Unit E of Section 12, Township 24 North, Range 2 West, T12M, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico in such a manner as to produce gas from the Ballad-Cliffa Pool and oil from the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool through the casing-coring annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete operations and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall make pressure and flow tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Test Period for the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of the Commission is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders of the Commission may deem necessary.
