Trans Delta Oil and Gas Co., Inc., is the operator of the following wells in Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, on Federal oil and gas lease Santa Fe 079352-A:

No. 2 Harrington-Federal, NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ 33-24N-1W
No. 3 Harrington-Federal, NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ 28-24N-1W
No. 7 Harrington-Federal, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ 32-24N-1W

The No. 2 well last produced in December 1968, the No. 3 well in April 1967, and the No. 7 well in April 1972.

Temporary abandonment of any well under jurisdiction of the U.S. Geological Survey must now receive formal approval. Such approval may be granted, for a period not to exceed one year, provided reasons for temporary abandonment are deemed adequate.

In order to comply with new guidelines for temporarily abandoned wells, please submit an original and four copies of Sundry Notice (form 9-331), for each of the above wells requesting approval of their temporary abandonments. These requests should set forth the present status, date of last production, reason for requesting temporary abandonment, and future plans for the wells including approximate dates of planned workovers or plugging operations.
