

The enclosed copies of Form C-122-A constitute a re-test of the deliverability of the McElvaine Miller A-1 well in the NE/NE of Section 13, T-24 North, R-7 West, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

The original test of this well produced an allowable of 633 MCF per day. Subsequent clean up of the Dakota formation, after water flood, proved the well capable of delivering approximately 950 MCF per day into the Southern Union gathering system. For this reason, the well was re-tested by the Dennis Owens Company and found to have a deliverability of 823.6 MCF per day.

On the evidence of this re-test we would like to have the Dakota monthly deliverability changed to 824 MCF per day.
