

THE APPLICATION OF CONTINENTAL OIL
COMPANY FOR A TRIPLE COMPLETION
(COMBINATION)

ORDER NO. MC-1210

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on June 18, 1962, for permission to triply complete its Jicarilla Apache 28 Well No. 2 located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 27, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Mesaverde Pool and oil from the Gallup formation and Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 9th day of July, 1962, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed triple completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed triple completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to triply complete its Jicarilla Apache 28 Well No. 2 located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 27, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Mesaverde Pool and oil from the Gallup formation and Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of 2 7/8-inch, 4 1/2-inch and 4 1/2-inch casing, respectively, cemented in a common well bore with 2 3/8 inch tubing installed in the 4 1/2-inch casing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take communication tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Mesaverde Zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause
