Dear Mr. Arnold:

We have been notified by our Drilling Department that they intend to move a workover rig on the above designated well on or about July 10, 1957. We request that any transfer of allowable from this well to offset wells, by virtue of this well being shut-in for interference test, cease as of this date.

If, following the workover on this well, sufficient volumes are being taken from the offset wells to allow the completion of an interference test within a reasonable time limit, the well may be shut-in again for test. Should this occur, we will notify you of our intentions at that time.

Shut-in pressures were taken by Southern Union representatives and witnessed by a representative of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on July 1, 1957. A pressure of 1019.5 to 1020.0 was recorded. The same pressure has been recorded since October, 1956.
