

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on July 20, 1962, for permission to triply complete its Jicarilla Apache 22 Well No. 1 located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 22, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Mesaverde formation and oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations.

Now, on this 9th day of August, 1962, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed triple completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed triple completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 22 Well No. 1 located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 22, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Mesaverde formation and oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations through parallel strings of 4- $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, 2- $\frac{7}{8}$ inch and 4- $\frac{1}{2}$ inch casing, respectively, cemented in a common well bore.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall install tubing for the production of oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take segregation tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Mesaverde formation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of this 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on July 30, 1961, for permission to drill complete its Apache 12 Well No. 1 located in the W-4 SE 1/4 of Section 12, Township 12 North, Range 4 West, N-4E, New Mexico. This formation is such a manner as to produce gas from the Mesaverde formation and oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations.

That on the 30th day of August, 1961, the Secretary-
Assistant Director

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of oil and gas wells have been duly notified, and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rules.
- (4) That the proposed drilling operation will not cause water not to be contaminated.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed drilling operation are feasible and conformant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to drill complete its Apache 12 Well No. 1 located in the W-4 SE 1/4 of Section 12, Township 12 North, Range 4 West, N-4E, New Mexico. This formation is such a manner as to produce gas from the Mesaverde formation and oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations through parallel strings of 4-1/2 inch, 2-1/2 inch and 2-1/8 inch casing, respectively, cemented in a common well bore.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply with the production of oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall comply, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take appropriate steps upon completion and annually thereafter during the term of the permit for the Mesaverde formation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That production of this gas is hereby retained for the entry of such future orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
