### DETAILS OF WORK

Spudded 12-1/4" hole on August 10, 1961. Set 8-5/8" casing at 175' with 120 sacks cement containing 2 percent Calcium Chloride. Circulated 10 sacks of cement. Tested 8-5/8" casing with 300 psi, which held with no indication of pressure drop. Reduced hole to 7-7/8" at 175'.

Set 4-1/2" casing at 3978' with 200 sacks 6 percent gal cement containing 1-1/2 pounds medium Taf Plug per sack followed by 100 sacks of neat cement. Tested 4-1/2" casing with 3000 psi for 15 minutes, which held with no indication of pressure drop. Resumed drilling operations.

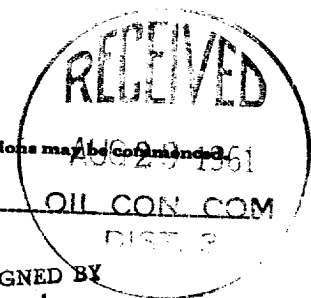
