Dear Mr. Spurrier:

Confirming my telephone conversation with you today, I request for The Superior Oil Company an unorthodox Pictured Cliffs Location 2610 feet from South line and 962 feet from East line of section 5, Township 25 North, Range 6 West, New Mexico Principal Meridian, to be known as Superior 1-5 Sealy Government.

This location is necessary because the federal lease upon which this well is to be drilled is not economically accessable in any orthodox location.

The well is a wildcat with the nearest Pictured Cliffs gas production approximately three miles to the northwest. This proposed location will fall in a canyon which runs through section five. To drill an orthodox location would require a very expensive road to mount the cliffs bordering this lease, and such an expense is not justified because the well is a wildcat.
