

THE APPLICATION OF CONTINENTAL OIL
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1681

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 25, 1965, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 30 Well No. 3 located in Unit J of Section 32, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from an undesignated Gallup oil pool and an undesignated Dakota oil pool.

NOW, on this 27th day of November, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 30 Well No. 3 located in Unit J of Section 32, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from an undesignated Gallup oil pool and an undesignated Dakota oil pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter on the anniversary date of the well's completion or as directed by the Secretary-Director of the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting
period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste
nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are
feasible and conformant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein (Continental Oil Company) be and
the same is hereby authorized to finally complete its leasehold
Apache No. 1 well, located in Unit 1 of Section 12, Township 12
North, Range 4 East, NMN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such
a manner as to produce oil from an underground stratum and
and an underground lateral oil pool through parallel strings
of tubing.

PROVIDING HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and
produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

PROVIDING FURTHER, that applicant shall take proper steps
to insure proper completion and annuities thereon on the anniversary
date of the well's completion or as directed by the Secretary-
Director of the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That termination of this order is hereby retained for the
entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
