

THE APPLICATION OF CONTINENTAL OIL
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1683

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 25, 1965, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 28 Well No. 3 located in Unit P of Section 34, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from an undesignated Gallup oil pool and an undesignated Dakota oil pool.

NOW, on this 27th day of November, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 28 Well No. 3 located in Unit P of Section 34, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from an undesignated Gallup oil pool and an undesignated Dakota oil pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter on the anniversary date of the well's completion or as directed by the Secretary-Director of the Commission.

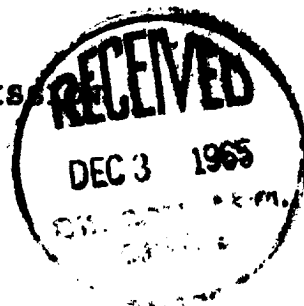
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 11-11-11, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 12, 1962, for permission to drill complete its 11-11-11 well No. 3 located in Unit 2 of Section 14, Township 12 North, Range 4 West, T12N, R4W, Santa Fe County, New Mexico, in order to produce oil from an undersaturated Gallup oil pool and an undersaturated Lakota oil pool.

Now, on this 11th day of November, 1962, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 11-11-11 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of oil and gas wells have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed well completion will not cause water not in place to be produced.
- (5) That the completion of the proposed well complies with the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to drill complete its 11-11-11 well No. 3 located in Unit 2 of Section 14, Township 12 North, Range 4 West, T12N, R4W, Santa Fe County, New Mexico, in order to produce oil from an undersaturated Gallup oil pool and an undersaturated Lakota oil pool through partial strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 11-11-11.

REVIEWED FURTHER, that applicant shall take proper steps to test upon completion and annually thereafter on the anniversary date of the well's completion or as directed by the Secretary-Director of the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this case is hereby retained for the review of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
