

THE APPLICATION OF SOUTHERN UNION PRODUCTION  
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1879

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Southern Union Production Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 12, 1969, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla "L" Well No. 3 located in Unit E of Section 3, Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool and gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 1st day of September, 1969, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Southern Union Production Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla "L" Well No. 3 located in Unit E of Section 3, Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool and gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

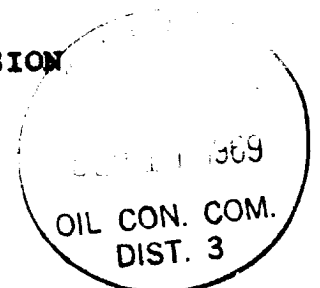
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:
