

THE APPLICATION OF CONTINENTAL OIL
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1872

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on July 14, 1969, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla 22 Well No. 4, located in Unit J of Section 15, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations.

NOW, on this 3rd day of August, 1969, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla 22 Well No. 4 located in Unit J of Section 15, Township 25 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from the Gallup and Dakota formations through a single string of 2-inch tubing with the production from both zones commingled by means of a MMA Mandrel with RG double check valve incorporated in the tubing string and located at approximately 6934 feet.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste non-harmful correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla 12 Well No. 4 located in Unit 7 of Section 12, Township 22 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce oil from the Gallup and Lakota formations through a single string of 2-inch tubing with the production from both zones completed by means of a MMA Mandrel with RC double check valve incorporated in the tubing string and located at approximately 6934 feet.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
