

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on January 20, 1972, for permission to dually complete its AXI Apache "J" well No. 18 located in Unit A of Section 8, Township 25 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Otero-Chacra Pool and the Mesaverde Formation.

Now, on this 2nd day of February, 1972, the Secretary-Director finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112- of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and

(3) That waivers of objection have been received from offsetting operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with in this instance.

(4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its AXI Apache "J" well No. 18 located in Unit A of Section 8, Township 25 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Otero-Chacra Pool and the Mesaverde Formation through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
