Reference is made to your letter of August 25, 1961 regarding re-work operations on your # 1 Federal well located in Section 15, 24N-9W.

It is my understanding that you wish to use approximately 1000 barrels of oil which has been produced from the well while testing for the purpose of sand-oil fracing. As you are not planning to market any oil at this time I do not believe it will be necessary for us to issue an oil supplement for this purpose.

You are hereby authorized to proceed as you have indicated in your letter with workover operations. At such time as it is necessary to remove oil from the lease please renew your request for a testing allowable, or if you are at that time ready to produce the well, file form C-104 request for allowable and form C-110, authorization to transport.
