Dear Mr. Arnold

In answer to your letter of November 15, 1968, concerning the completion of Navajo "L" No. 1, please be advised that this well has not been completed and no work has been performed on the well since 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " casing was cemented on December 18, 1967. Enclosed are copies of USGS Form 9-329, Lessee's Monthly Report of Operations, for the period of December, 1967, to October, 1968. Two copies of this form were mailed to NMOCC, Santa Fe, which is our understanding of the proper procedure.

As reflected by these reports, the rotary rig was moved off the well during July, 1968 and the well has been sitting with a cap on the braden-head since that time. We have been carrying the well in a suspended operations category. Please advise if this is not satisfactory and a notice of intention to temporarily abandon can be filed.

Our plans for the well are still indefinite, but we are again into winter time operations and will probably not want to do any additional work before next summer at the earliest. You can be assured we will file the proper forms for your approval before performing any work on the well.

If additional information is needed, please advise.
