Re: Applications for Permit to Drill, Navajo #1, Navajo #1 & Navajo #1

Dear Mr. McCutchin:

We have received copies of Federal Form 9-331-C, Permit to Drill Wells, for three wells all identified as Navajo #1. New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rules and Regulations require that wells on separate leases be identified under separate lease names and numbered sequentially on each lease. As each of the three wells mentioned are on separate base leases, I am suggesting that they be identified as set out below:

780/S; 380/E Sec. 15, 24N-19W Navajo 57 #1

2310/S: 400/W Sec. 23, 24N-19W Navajo 59 #1

2110/S: 1660/W Sec. 31, 29N-16W Navajo 11 #1

As you will note this utilizes the last two numbers in the lease number as a means of identifying the separate leases. If you approve of my suggestion, please let me know and we will make the necessary changes on the forms filed. If you prefer a different solution, also please let me know.
