The above named company is hereby authorized to commingle, measure and sell off-lease Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas - 71629) production from the following San Juan County leases all located in Township 24 North, Range 10 West, NMPM:

Production from these gas wells shall be gathered, commingled and sold through a CDP located in the NW/4 NW/4, Section 10, Township 24 North, Range 10 West, NMPM. Individual well orifice flow meters shall be installed and gas sales shall be allocated based on these individual meters. Water and condensate production will be separated at each well.

NOTE: This installation shall be installed and operated in accordance with the applicable provisions of Rule 309-B of the Division Rules and Regulations and the Division "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities." It is the responsibility of the producer to notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

FURTHER: The operator shall notify the Aztec district office of the Division prior to commingling. This commingle order is contingent on like approval by the Bureau of Land Management and the New Mexico State Land Office.
