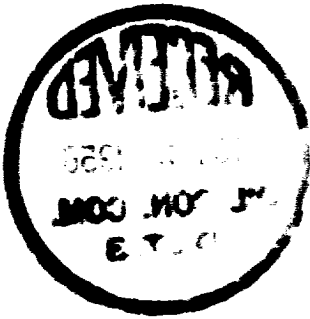
Please submit in duplicate a production test on each zone tested for this well showing successive pressures and production therefrom. In the future submit this same information for each zone tested in each dual or triple completion.
