
Dear Sir:

This letter is to notify you of a change in dual completion plans regarding the above well.

It was originally planned to complete this well in the Mesa Verde and Pictured Cliffs formations. Results of stimulative treatment found the Mesa Verde formation to be non-commercial, however. It is therefore planned to squeeze off the Mesa Verde perforations with the proper amount of cement to ensure a proper shut-off, leaving a cast-in-place cementing retainer with bridging bar above the Mesa Verde perforations as a permanent bridge plug.

The Chacra and Pictured Cliffs formations have been perforated and fractured, and the well will be completed in the Chacra and Pictured Cliffs formations as a gas-gas dual. A production packer will be set on 2" E.U.E. tubing between the two pay zones, and a 1 1/4" siphon string will be landed opposite the Pictured Cliffs perforations. Upon final successful completion a formal application for dual completion will be submitted to the Oil Conservation Commission in Santa Fe. The name of this well will be changed to Johnston State No. 3 (CP).
