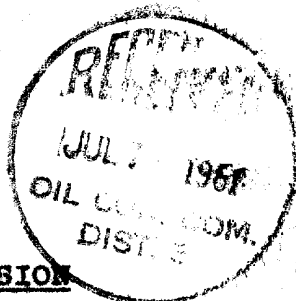


THE APPLICATION OF PAN AMERICAN

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION



Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (II) Pan American Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on June 9, 1961, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla Gas Unit "B" Well No. 1 located in the SW/4 NE/4 of Section 31, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Chacra Pool and the production of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 29th day of June, 1961, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section II of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Gas Unit "B" Well No. 1 located in the SW/4 NE/4 of Section 31, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Chacra Pool and the production of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section VI Rule 112-A.

CHACRA POOL AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS
FROM THE BASIN-DAKOTA POOL

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (11) Pan American
Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil
Conservation Commission on June 9, 1961, for permission to dually
complete its Vicarilla Gas Unit "B" Well No. 1 located in the SW/4
NE/4 of Section 31, Township 28 North, Range 5 West, HMM, Rio
Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the
production of gas from an undesignated Chacra Pool and the production
of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 28th day of June, 1961, the Secretary-
Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the
provisions of sub-section II of Rule 112-A of the Commission's
Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided
that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the
waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause
waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion
are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Pan American Petroleum
Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete
its Vicarilla Gas Unit "B" Well No. 1 located in the SW/4 NE/4 of
Section 31, Township 28 North, Range 5 West, HMM, Rio Arriba
County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of
gas from an undesignated Chacra Pool and the production of gas
from the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate,
and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of section
VI Rule 112-A.

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PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of conservative rights upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order. The Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
