Dear Sir:

We have a copy of your letter of July 21, 1964 addressed to Consolidated Oil & Gas Company regarding the deliverability test for their #3-26 Lowe well. We had previously discussed this problem with Mr. Clyde Phillips of Consolidated Oil & Gas and were aware of the fact that there were irregularities during the flow week which might make the test unacceptable. However, as this is the first test on this well and as rejection of this test would very likely cause loss of allowable on the well due to late test filing we informed Mr. Phillips that we would accept this test as an initial test. However, we also notified him that the well should be immediately re-scheduled for a regular annual deliverability test. We also informed him that if the test results on the succeeding test are no reasonably in line with the results on the previous test, then we will amend the allowable on the well back to the date of connection, using the later test. We therefore request that this well be re-scheduled for annual deliverability test at your earliest convenience.
