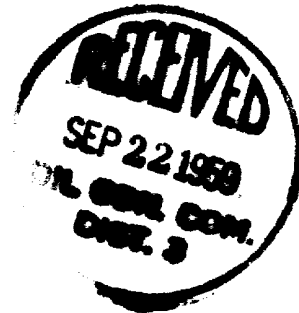

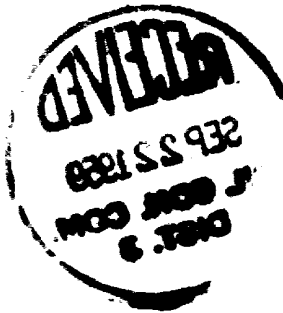

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Caulkins Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 24, 1959 for permission to dually complete its Breech "C" well No. MD-244 located in the NE/4 NE/4 Section 14, Township 26 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico in such a manner as to permit the production of Gas from an undesignated Mesaverde Formation and the production of Gas from an undesignated Dakota Formation.

Now, on this 14th day of September, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Caulkins Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Breech "C" well No. MD-244 located in the NE/4 NE/4 Section 14, Township 26 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico in such a manner as to permit the production of Gas from an undesignated Mesaverde Formation and the production of Gas from an undesignated Dakota Formation, through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability test Period for the Dakota Zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights;
