Dear Mr. Hoy:

We are returning your copies of Gas Well Plat on the Honolulu #1
Jicarilla-Apache well in the SW/4 Section 10-26N-4W. At the present
time production from this area is not prorated, so the question
of the number of acres dedicated is not at this time an important
consideration. I would like to point out, however, that 320-acre
spacing for gas wells in the Pictured Cliffs formation has not been
approved by the Oil Conservation Commission anywhere in the San
Juan Basin as of this date. The standard spacing for any wildcat is
160 acres and if proration should come to that area the proration
unit will be set upon the basis of 160 acres unless further action
is taken by the Oil Conservation Commission to establish 320-acre
proration units in this area.

At the present time the Commission has under advisement a case asking for 320-acre spacing in this general area. The case was brought to hearing by the America Petroleum Company. I presume they will reach a decision in the near future and at that time it would probably be advisable for you to re-file gas well plats in accordance with their findings if they should decide in favor of 160-acre units.
