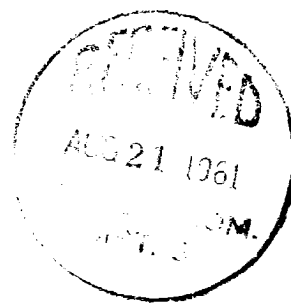

Dear Sir:

In compliance with paragraph "e" of Rule 9, Order Number B-1191, we request your approval of the conversion of our Breech "A" T-207 to a water injection well. This well is located 660' from the south line and 1980' from the east line of section 10-26N-6W, Rio Arriba County, and is part of the South Blanco Tooto Water Injection Project.

The present production from this well is 6 barrels oil and 220 barrels water per day. It cannot be operated profitably at that rate and it is our belief that it would now be more valuable to the project if used for water injection.

All of the South Blanco Tooto Water Injection Project is on Federal land at present and Geological Survey Form 9-331a is attached showing their approval of the proposed conversion by Mr. P. T. McGrath, District Engineer for the Survey in this district.

El Paso Natural Gas Products Company is the only operator offsetting the Project and they are being notified of the proposed conversion by copy of this letter.
