

THE APPLICATION OF CONSOLIDATED
OIL & GAS, INC. FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1528

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 7, 1964, for permission to dually complete its Northwest Federal Well No. 4-8 located in Unit B of Section 8, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Gallup Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 27th day of August, 1964, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Northwest Federal Well No. 4-8 located in Unit B of Section 8, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Gallup Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool, through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

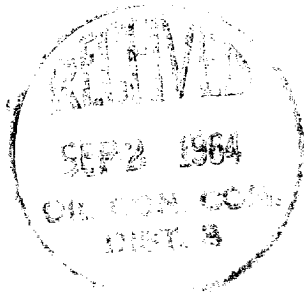
PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 111-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That necessary information has been furnished to the Commission in support of offset charges have been duly notified and that all objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (3) That the proposed dual completion shall not be made nor shall correlative rights.
- (4) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant hereby, Consolidated Oil & Gas Company, and the same is hereby authorized to drill and operate its Northwest Federal Well No. 4-8 located in Township 16 North, Range 4 West, T16N, R4W, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an underground pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool, through parallel openings at the

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall comply, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 111-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take, before lease tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that production of gas shall be hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
