Dear Mr. Bolin:

We have your letter of November 30, 1964 inquiring about an allowable change subsequent to workover on your #4 Candado well in Section 3-26N-7W.

An initial deliverability test was filed subsequent to workover on this well and it was issued a new allowable effective July 14, 1964 based upon a deliverability of 124 MFPD. The regular annual test was then submitted on November 19 showing a deliverability of 139 MFPD and a supplement was issued December 2 correcting the allowable to this new deliverability. This supplement was sent to our Santa Fe office where the allowable will be re-calculated and a copy will be mailed to you when that is done. Therefore, I believe the matter has been properly taken care of and no further action by you is required.

three copies of a report on the progress of the work of the Commission during the first three months of its operation. The report is being distributed to all members of the Commission and to the public.

The Commission was organized on January 1, 1964, and has since that time been working to develop a program of oil conservation. The first step in this program was the establishment of a committee to study the problem of oil conservation. This committee has held several public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. The Commission is now working on a plan of action which will be submitted to the Governor for his approval. This plan will provide for the establishment of a permanent oil conservation committee, the creation of a fund for the purpose of carrying out oil conservation programs, and the appointment of a director of oil conservation. The Commission is confident that this plan will be approved by the Governor and that it will be an important step in the development of a program of oil conservation in New Mexico.

Filings by our company as operator reported a casing failure in subject well and subsequent filings reported repair of same. On November 19, 1964 we filed a new deliverability showing a considerable increase over the last annual deliverability test. Not being thoroughly familiar with your New Mexico Commission law, we are inquiring as to whether we are entitled to an increase in allowable retroactive to official date of well repair. If there is an additional type of test that needs to be performed and filed or perhaps merely an application to accomplish this increase, we would appreciate your advising the means of accomplishing the increase.
