We will not be able to approve an allowable for this well until you have filed Federal Form 9-331-a, Miscellaneous Notices, with the U.S.G.S. office in Farmington indicating that you have cemented both surface and production casing in the above well and have conducted casing tests as prescribed by New Mexico Oil Commission rules and regulations.*

*Upon compliance with the Commission casing regulations, please re-submit Federal Well Record form and also re-submit Form C-104 showing the proper casing information.*
