
I, Frank Gray, being first duly sworn upon my oath,

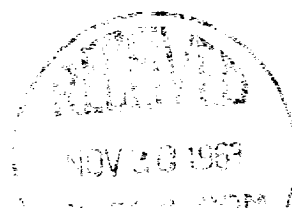

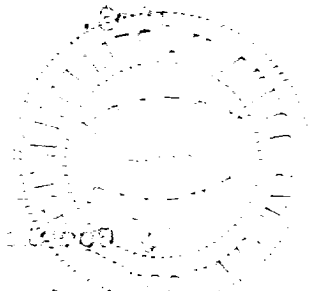
