All five of the locations are on Bureau of Land Management lands and the survey was conducted under Federal Antiquities Permit 75-NM-013.


#19 CANDADO

Proposed well #19 Candado has a 600 foot access and is 1430 feet from the south line and 1035 feet from the west line of Section 3,

Township 26 North, Range 7 West, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico,
N.M.P.M. (Figure 1)

The location is on a ridge in rolling broken terrain with a south westerly slope. The soil is clayey sand and the vegetation consists of juniper, sagebrush, and blue grama.

No cultural resources were found and clearance is recommended.
