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NORTHWEST NEW MEXICO PACKER LEAKAGE TEST INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. A packer leakage test shall be commenced on each multiply completed well within seven days ofter acusal completion of the well, and annually theresher as prescribed by the order suthorizing the multiple completion. Such nest shall also be commenced on all multiple completions within seven days following recompletion and/or chemical or fest-nace treatment, and whenever remedial work has been done on a well during which the packer or the noting have been disrushed. Tests shall also be taken or any time that communication is respected or when requested by the Division.
- 2. At least 72 hours prior to the commencement of any packer leakage test, the operator shall notify the Division in writing of the exact time the test is to be commenced. Offset operators shall also be so notified.
- 3. The packer leakage test shall commence when both zones of the dual completion are shut-in for pressure stabilization. Both zones shall remain shut-in until the well-head pressure in each has stabilized, provided however, that they need not remain shut-in more than neven days.
- 4. For Flow Ten No. 1, one zone of the dual completion shall be produced at the normal rate of production while the other zone remains shut-in. Such ten shall be continued for seven days in the case of a gas well and for 24 hours in the case of an oil well. Note: if, on an initial packer leakage test, a gas well is being flowed to the aumaphere due to the lack of a pipeline connection the flow period shall be three hours.
- Following completion of Flow Ten No. 1, the well shall again be shut-in, in accordance with Paragraph 3 above.
- Flow Test'No. 2 shall be conducted even though no link was indicated during Flow Test No. 1. Procedure for Flow Test No. 2 is so be the name as for Flow Test No. 1 except

- that the previously produced some shall remain abor-in while the some which was previously abor-in is produced.
- 7. Pressures for par-sone term must be measured on each sone with a deadweight pressure gauge at time intervals as follows: 3 hours tester immediately prior to the beginning of each flow-petiod, at fifteen-minuse intervals during the first hour themof, and at hously intervals thereafter, including one pressure measurement immediately prior to the conclusion of each flow period. 7-day teste: immediately prior to the beginning of each flow period, at least one time during each flow period (at approximately the midway point) and immediately prior to the conclusion of each flow period. Other parasures may be eaten as desired, or may be requested on wells which have previously shown questionable test data.

24-hour oil zone texts: all pressures, throughout the entire text, shall be untinuously measured and recorded with seconding pressure gauges the accuracy of which must be therefor at least twice, once at the beginning and once at the end of each mix, with a deadweight pressure gauge. If a well is a gas-oil or an oil-gas dual completion, the recording gauge shall be required on the oil zone only, with deadweight pressures as required above being taken on the gas assoc.

B. The results of the above-described sess shall be filed in suplicate within 12 days after complexion of the test. Tests shall be filed with the Arter District Office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division on Northwest New Mexico Pather Leakage Test Form Revised 10-01-78 with all deadweight pressures indicated thereon as well as the flowing temperatures (gas sones only) and gravity and GOR (oil sones only).
