Re: NMOCD Order No. R-7509 Case No. 8151 Jicarilla H #12 Rio Arriba County, New Mexico

On April 20, 1984, the NMOCD approved our application to commingle the Wild Horse - Gallup and Basin Dakota in the Jicarilla H #12 well. The location given on the order "1210 FNL; 690' FEL, Section 17, T26N-R4W, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico" was in error.

The location had to be moved to "434 FNL; 625' FEL, Section 17, T26N-R4W, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico" for archeological reasons. Please reference May 1, 1984 letter from the Department of Interior to Mr. Bob Lafollette granting relocation clearance, August 8, 1984 letter to Mr. Gilbert Quintana requesting administrative approval, letter from Mr. Rudy Motto August 9, 1984 correcting the location shown in the August 8 communication, and letter from Joe D. Ramey granting administrative approval by Order Number NSL-1860, August 9, 1984.

The well was subsequently spudded on September 5, 1984 and completed on October 30, 1984. This letter and back up documentation should correct the location shown in the referenced Case #8151.
