

Jicarilla Apache A118 Lease Venting Clarification

Amoco Production Company is currently venting approximately 30 MCFD to the production pit from the following wells:

|                              |          |

| Jicarilla Apache A118 No. 14 | C36-26-3 |
| Jicarilla Apache A118 No. 17 | P26-26-3 |

It is believed that gas is breaking out of solution in the low stage of the production units on these wells and being vented to the pit. Amoco is evaluating alternate production facilities to determine if it is possible to recover this gas.
