2. Furnish copies of all logs.



DETAILS OF WORK

Propose to spud with cable tools; then drill with rotary tools to the top of the Pictured Cliffs Formation - expected between 1,500 feet and 2,000 feet below the surface. Completion with cable tools - and sand oil fracturing or shooting with solidified nitro-glycerin as conditions warrant.

Casing program: 90 feet 2-5/8" new 8 rd. thd. 34# casing. Circulate cement to surface, using at least 75 sacks of cement.

5-1/2" O.D. 14# J-55 casing to be set on top of Pictured Cliffs Formation, cemented with 100 sacks of regular cement.

1" tubing to be set within 20 feet of total depth for production.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.


