DETAILS OF WORK

This well was spudded on June 27, 1957, and on June 28, 1957, 8-5/8" casing was set at 293' with 290 sacks of cement. After waiting on cement for 24 hours, casing and water shut off were tested with 500 pounds pressure for 30 minutes with no drop in pressure.

On July 13, 1957, 5-1/2" casing was set at 5010' with 75 sacks of cement, followed by 75 sacks of cement. After waiting on cement for 5 days, casing and water shut off were tested with 2500 pounds pressure for 15 minutes with no drop in pressure.
