DETAILS OF WORK

Drill 13 2 1/4 inch Rotary hole to 110 foot. Set 100 feet of 10 3/4 inch surface casing. Circulate out with 100 sacks.

Drill 8 3/4 inch hole to 3100' or top of Pictured Cliff - set 20%, 7 inch with 100 sacks regular cement.

Drill 6 inch hole with Cable tools from 3100 to 3200 feet.

Shoot open hole, tamped, with 300 quarts Nitro Gel.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
