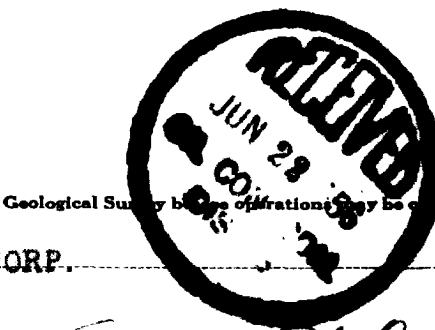

Breakdown pressure 1500#, treating pressure 1500#, injection rate 33.5 barrels per minute under pressure. After treatment flowing 1,155 MCF/day.
