DETAILS OF WORK

On July 31, 1952, 7" casing was landed at 2005 feet and cemented with 150 sacks of cement. Jog down at 6:30 P.M., July 31, 1952. At 3:30 A.M., August 3, 1952, casing and water shut-off were tested at 800 pounds pump pressure for 30 minutes. No drop in pressure. Thirty feet of solid cement were drilled in bottom of pipe and water shut-off was again tested at 800 pounds for 30 minutes. No drop in pressure. Drilling operations were resumed.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
