

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO NATURAL GAS COMPANY FOR PERMISSION TO EFFECT DUAL COMPLETION OF ITS HUERFANO UNIT WELL NO. 108 LOCATED IN THE SW/4 NW/4 OF SECTION 1, TOWNSHIP 26 NORTH, RANGE 10 WEST, NMPM, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF OIL FROM THE ANGEL PEAK-GALLUP OIL POOL AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM AN UNDESIGNATED DAKOTA POOL ADJACENT TO THE ANGEL PEAK-DAKOTA POOL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on March 10, 1960, for permission to dually complete its Huerfano Unit Well No. 108 located in the SW/4 NW/4 of Section 1, Township 26 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Angel Peak-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool adjacent to the Angel Peak-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 30th day of March, 1960, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Huerfano Unit Well No. 108 located in the SW/4 NW/4 of Section 1, Township 26 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Angel Peak-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool adjacent to the Angel Peak-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

Under the provisions of Rule 113-A (c) El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on March 20, 1960, for permission to drill completion its Hurstano Unit Well No. 102 located in the SW 1/4 of Section 1, Township 26 North, Range 10 West, MERIDIAN, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Angel Peak-Gallop Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool adjacent to the Angel Peak-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 30th day of March, 1960, the Secretary-Treasurer

finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of section 10 of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rules;
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor injure correlative rights;
- (5) That the chances of the proposed dual completion are reasonable and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to drill completion its Hurstano Unit Well No. 102 located in the SW 1/4 of Section 1, Township 26 North, Range 10 West, MERIDIAN, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Angel Peak-Gallop Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool adjacent to the Angel Peak-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER,

That applicant shall complete, operate and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section 11, Rule

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PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Dakota Zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
